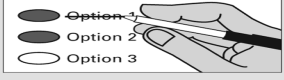
Instructions

How to vote



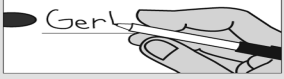
Use a dark blue or black ink pen to completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice. Vote for one in each race. If you vote for more than one, no votes will be counted for that race.

To vote for a candidate not listed for that race, fill in the oval to the left of the line and print the name of the candidate.
